Examples of Ministries We'll Work With

1. SafeHouse Outreach (<u>facebook.com/SafeHouseOutreach/about</u>)

SafeHouse Outreach is an urban outreach committed to creating paths to self-sufficiency for those on the streets of Atlanta and to replicating intentional living for those who serve with us. Through a motto of 'A hand-up, not just a Hand-Out' SafeHouse provides practical, emotional, and physical assistance to those in-need; helping to integrate individuals back into society – to lead healthy, functional lives.

2. 7 Bridges (7bridgestorecovery.org)

7 Bridges to Recovery is a non-profit 501c3 organization that reaches out to the lost and broken of Atlanta and beyond. We house and feed Women, Children, Men, and Veterans and assist them in rebuilding their life with Jesus.

Based off of Isaiah 58:6-8, our goal is to end homelessness in Atlanta, then in Georgia, then in the United States and eventually in the world with the love of Christ, one person at a time. We are the Rescue Team for Jesus!

We go under the bridges of Atlanta and into an area called the Bluff (Atlanta's largest crack cocaine and prostitution district) where we feed and meet physical needs with the goal of sharing Christ and eventually getting the homeless off the streets.

We have a home for 105 women and children and a program for 25 men that have all been rescued from the streets. These men and women continue to go to the streets multiple times a week reaching out to the lost.

3. M.U.S.T. Ministries (mustministries.org)

MUST brings people together to minister to others with compassion and love.

Our Mission:

Serving our neighbors in need ... transforming lives and communities in response to Christ's call.

Our Vision:

To become Georgia's most respected Servant Leader - Restoring lives one person and one community at a time.

Scope of work:

• Students will be able to safely interact with, pray for, and serve the people in the streets of Atlanta.

• A typical day involves making meals in the morning, and then deploying to all parts of Atlanta to hand them out. We've seen students evangelize, pray for, and serve the community in ways that make an indelible mark on their souls.

• Some groups will sort through donations and interact with clients at donation/shopping centers.

• Other students might be doing physical labor – all groups will be able to form relational bonds with the people they're ministering to as well those in their work groups.

Project Serve Session Theme: Revival

This year's theme is "Revival," where each session we will focus on the churches mentioned in Revelation 2 – they'll learn about each church, get historical background information, and hopefully glean lessons about what Jesus was calling out in them. They'll have time to reflect on what this means in their own lives, and our prayer is that this week would spark a revival in their hearts.
